River's Edge Retreats Provide Much Needed Respite for Cleveland's First Responders

“Today we’re not going to sit around and cry or anything like that. If you want to cry feel free, that’s fine, but the goal today is to do some practice that is going to help you learn how to relax. And I think you’re really, really going to enjoy it. I guarantee you’ll be snoring at the end of the day.”

So spoke Cleveland police officer Chris Gibbons as he introduced “A Day of Mindful Living,” an innovative program for the Cleveland Division of Police, held at River’s Edge, a spirituality and wellness center and sponsored ministry of the Congregation of St. Joseph.

The program, held on February 9, was the latest of six mindfulness training days designed to introduce law enforcement personnel to mindfulness practices such as yoga and meditation to manage stress and enhance their effectiveness on the street.

Such programs are increasingly popular with police departments around the country who have been

introducing mindfulness practices to help officers deal with the inevitable stress that goes with their jobs.

Gibbons, who comes from a long line of police officers, all of whom served in Cleveland neighborhoods plagued by violence, began searching for more effective ways to help his officers manage stress. He remembered retreats he had attended as a student at St. Ignatius High School.

“It was great experience. I loved it,” he said. “We were every bit the nitwits just like high school boys. And yet we all connected to the retreats. So, I thought, if young high school boys could connect with this, why couldn’t adult police officers?”

Since the first program last year, 53 officers and other command staff have attended the retreats, all of whom reported feeling less stressed at the end of the day, and nearly all said they planned to continue the sitting and resting meditative practices as well as yoga.

“We are very pleased to be able to provide this well-deserved day of rest and restoration for members of our police force,” said Maureen Powers, Executive Director of River’s Edge. “Providing transformative experiences like these is one of the cornerstones of our mission.” ●

Antiracism Workshop Held

Almost 50 sisters, associates, staff, and friends participated in “Understanding and Analyzing System Racism,” a workshop held May 9-11 at St. Joseph Center. The workshop was facilitated by Crossroads Antiracism Organizing and Training, an organization whose mission is to dismantle systemic racism within institutions and build anti-racist multicultural diversity through training. Participants explored the historical development of institutional racism in the U.S., analyzed how it operates and shapes individual identity and work, learned how to create a shared language for talking about it effectively within their organization, and examined ways to equip their institution with a framework for moving toward anti-racist transformation.

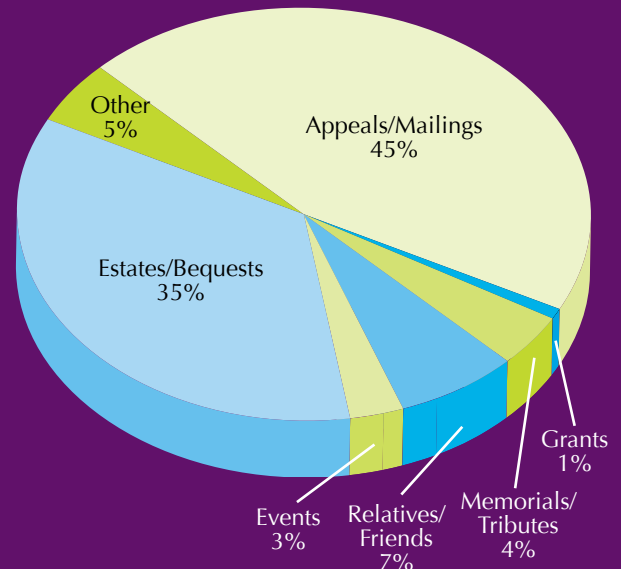

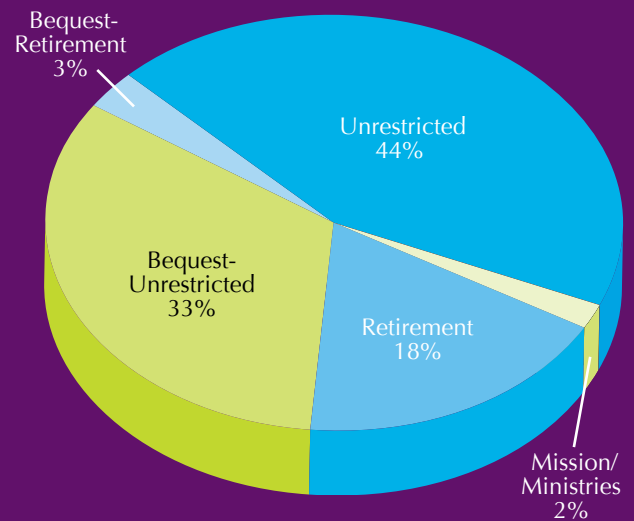
