## Building COMMUNITY for PEACE



For five days in June, students gathered with sisters at Mount St. Joseph to take part in our annual Community Builders for Peace, a program sponsored by the Congregation of St. Joseph that empowers young people to actions that foster peace and justice.

The students, from Nazareth Academy in La Grange Park, IL, Maria Reina Academy in Puerto Rico and Wheeling Central Catholic High School, were immersed in the mission and spirituality of the congregation and also in ministry. That included working in the fields of Grow Ohio Valley, preparing a meal at House of Hagar (Catholic Worker House and Soup Kitchen), learning about the dangers and toxic results of coal mining, and playing with children at the Fun Raiser Ministry Project.

At the end of the week, each school team created a justice project that they will take back to their respective schools and implement over the course of the next year and beyond. Each team has a young adult mentor to whom they will report back to on the progress and results of their projects.

## The *Plight* of the *Monarch*

*Did you know...*

...that 1 out of every 3 bites of food you eat is there because of pollinators like the Monarch Butterfly? Did you also know that every fall, the Monarch's migrate 2,500 miles south to Mexico, and then make the trek back north in the spring, passing directly over West Virginia?

These creatures are as necessary to the food chain as they are beautiful, but sadly, they are in trouble. Their numbers are down 90% of what they were in 1992, and the milkweed plant population, which is indispensable to the Monarch, is also down 90%. Milkweed is the only source of food for the monarch caterpillar, but these plants are rapidly disappearing due to land development and the widespread spraying of weed killer.

Never ones to stand idly by, our sisters, associates and staff in Wheeling decided to do something to help the Monarchs. A plot of land at Mount St. Joseph is being planted with milkweed and other pollinator attractors such as wildflowers. This habitat is one of many being planted around the country by conservationists and regular folks alike who understand the importance of these creatures to our sustainable food chain, and also to preserving one of God's endangered creatures. ●

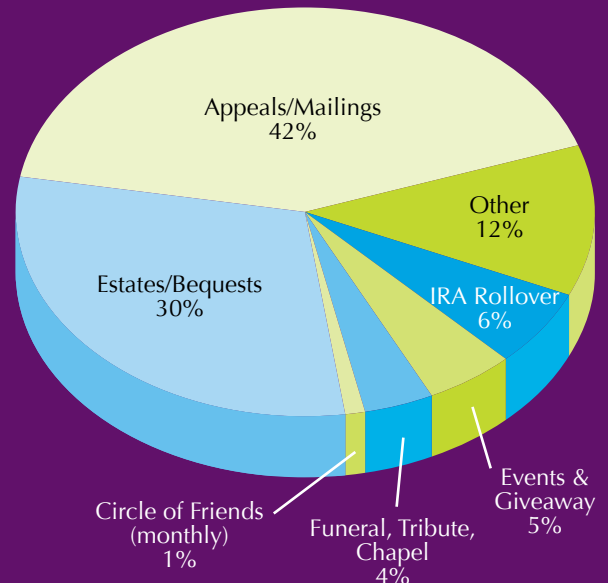

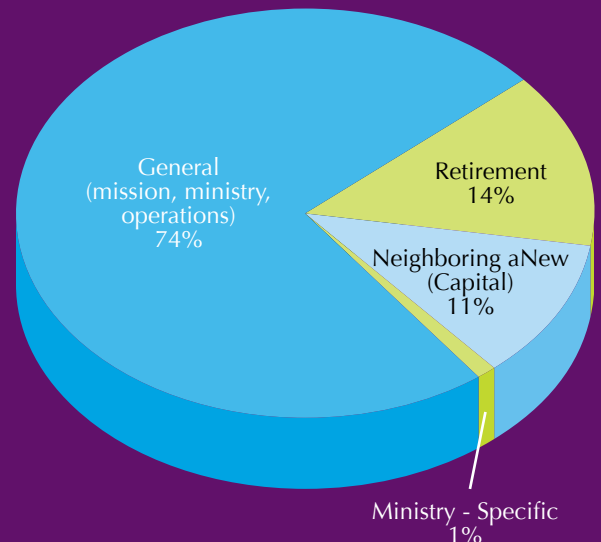
